(This is a New Hampshire Event Only)

State Display - a chapter event, recognizes chapters who present a display that promotes the mission of FCCLA to an unfamiliar, non-school related audience. The display will also represent the theme of the Spring Conference. (Theme will change every year.)

EVENT CATEGORIES

Junior: through grade 9

Senior: grades 10-12

Occupational: grades 10-12

ELIGIBILITY

1. Chapters may submit one entry in each category of this event.
2. An event category is determined by participants' previous or current enrollment in family and consumer sciences related course work and grade in school during the school year preceding the National Leadership Meeting.
3. Participation is open to any nationally affiliated FCCLA chapter member.
4. The State Display must be developed and completed within a one-year span beginning July 1 and ending June 30 of the school year before the National Leadership Meeting.
5. The State Display and all supporting materials must be planned, conducted, and prepared by the participant(s) only.
6. This event has no oral presentation.

PROCEDURES & TIME REQUIREMENTS

1. The display must be used to educate an audience about the FCCLA organizations and the theme for the Spring Conference.

2. The display summary form must be attached to the display.
3. The display must be set up at least once prior to the State Spring Conference.
4. The display will be no larger than 4 feet by 5 feet by 6 feet high. FREE STANDING.
5. One to two chapter members will set up the display before the start of the first general session.
6. There is no orientation.
7. Students will not be interviewed. The display will be judged on its' own merits.
8. Judges will have 10 to 20 minutes to judge each display. Participants will not be present during judging.
9. Evaluators will use the rating sheet to score and write comments for participant(s). Then, evaluators will meet with each other to discuss participants' strengths and suggestions for improvement.
10. The total time required for this event is approximately 20 minutes.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. A table will be provided. Participant(s) must bring all other necessary supplies and/or equipment. Wall space will not be available.
2. Electrical outlets must be requested through the adviser. Extension cords and power strips are not provided.
